Surviving are one son, Richard Wells, of West Van Lear; one daughter, Edith Mollett, of Boons Camp; and eight Grandchildren and 13 greatr-grandchildren. Funeral service was held March 1. 1991. in Jones-Preston Funeral Home Chapel, with Bill Pollack officiating.

Burial was in the family cemetery at Boons Camp. George Wells was the oldest surviving member of the Wells family. His great grandfather, Richard Wells, was a veteran of the American Revolution. His grandfather, William Green Wells, was a Captain in the Confederate Army during the Civil War, and his father, Aaron Wells, was a private in the Confederate Army. George was a veteran of World War I, while George's son, Richard, was a veteran of the Korean War.
