

On 4/26/16, MOUNTAIN SPORTS HALL OF FAME posted on Facebook the following Trivia Tuesday question: This guy from our coverage area played baseball for Morehead State where he was an all-conference catcher three consecutive years with a batting avg. for those three years of .350. After his playing days he returned to his county to coach and as a result of that career he has since been inducted into the Kentucky High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Can you name him?

On 4/28/16, **Mountain Sports Hall of Fame** posted the following:

Answer to Tuesday Trivia: Mike Collins



Collins went to school at tiny Van Lear High School in Johnson County graduating in 1963. He was on the high school baseball team as a 7th grader but did not see much action until the 8th grade when he became the starting catcher. He also played

basketball there where his shot from the corner was deadly, and his rebounding was rugged. His high school years melted away too quickly but left a lot of people scratching their heads and wanting to see him play more.

Collins took his baseball game to Morehead State University where he excelled and made all conference (OVC) three years, though it was not three consecutive years as was posed in the trivia question. Info was not available at time the question was posted. He was 1st team all-conference his freshman (1964), junior and senior years (1966 & '67) but failed to be on the allconference team his sophomore year due to a lingering illness that began the season and slowed his numbers for the year. His batting avg. over the years at MSU was .350. As a result of his prowess as a hitter and catcher, Collins was inducted into MSU Hall of Fame in 2001. Collins was signed by the New York Mets organization to a free agent contract and played professionally three years into AA baseball with them until he made the decision to return to his roots. One game as a pro that he remembers well was at Reno where he hit two home runs and a double. He remembers catching two future Major League Hall of Famers that were on their way to the majors- Nolan Ryan and Tom Seaver. "You could sit in a rocking chair and catch Seaver. He was always in the black (edge of home plate) and knee high on his pitches."

After returning to Johnson County he became the baseball coach at Johnson Central High School where he amassed 492 wins. It was always a treat for fans when his team played cross town rival Paintsville, coached by Collins' friend and battery mate at Morehead, Charlie Adkins. His best performances in high school that he remembers: One game as a senior at Prestonsburg where their right field wall was tall but not that far away from home plate so if the ball was hit over the wall it became a ground rule double. Collins, a natural left handed hitter said to heck with that and switched over to bat from the right side of the plate so he could pull the ball toward left field. Result? Three home runs and a double to left that day.

Another high school highlight came at Auxier High School in Floyd County where he hit four home runs that went across the street in rt., past a yard and hit the same house on three of the four home runs. The fourth went over the house. "It about beat his house to death."

College highlights? Here are just two: One was a game at Morehead against Tennessee Tech. In that game Collins hit a grand slam, providing all the runs while his friend and future rival Charlie Adkins threw a shutout. Also standing out in his memory is a game against Ohio University when he had a grand slam and a double. As coach at Johnson Central High School, Collins had a total of 492 coaching victories. Besides being in MSU's Hall of Fame, Collins has also been inducted into the Kentucky Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame.

Mike is the son of the late Carl and Polly Wells Collins. He descends from Richard Wells through George E. Wells, William G. Wells, and Agnes Wells Auxier.
