Dear Cousins,

My name is Danny K. Blevins, and I was asked to serve as the president of the Wells Family Association for 2016 - 2017. I have had the privilege of meeting several of you at the many family reunions I have attended over

the years, but perhaps some of you still don't know me.

I am in the George E. Wells line. My grandfather was Beecher Wells who was born and raised at Odds, KY. My parents are Phyllis Wells Blevins and the late Danny E. Blevins of Van Lear, KY. I was born in Wabash, IN, as my parents had moved there to find work in the early 1960's. We moved to Van Lear when I was about three years old.

In 1979, I graduated from Johnson Central High. My post-secondary educational background is very diverse. I hold degrees and/or diplomas from Mayo State Vocational Technical School, Prestonsburg Community College, Morehead State University, and Union College. I am a Rank I teacher with certifications in Social Science and General Science. In 1999, I completed training in the NASA "NEW" program at NASA Langley Research Center in Hampton, VA. I hold a lifetime Ground Radio Operator's License with RADAR and a General Class Amateur Radio Operator's License.

In addition to teaching in the public school system, I have worked extensively with the East Kentucky Science Center in Prestonsburg and the Morehead Space Science Center in Morehead, KY. (This television show was produced by our own Ronnie Wells.) Presently, I work as a substitute teacher.

History and genealogy have always been interests of mine. I feel very privileged to have been the student of many great history and social studies educators. Mr. Edward R. Hazelette, Drs. Thom Matijasic, Jack Bizzel, Victor Howard, and Stuart Seely Sprague to name but a few. I am a President Emeritus of the Van Lear, KY Historical Society, Inc. I am also the founder of the Van Lear Historical Society's quarterly newsletter, "The Bankmule." I am a past recipient of the Kentucky Historical Society's Award of Distinction and, on the national level, I have received the Leadership in Local History Award from the American Association for State and Local History. In 2008, Arcadia Publishing Company released my book, "Van Lear" as part of their Images of America series. Currently, I am working on the biography of Lt. Col. Harry T. Stewart, Jr. USAF Ret. who was one of the famous "Red Tails" of the 332nd Fighter Group.

I reside in Van Lear, Kentucky with my wife, Ida "Trudy" Butcher Blevins. Trudy is in the Mary Wells Butcher line, she being the daughter of Clarinda Hampton Butcher and the late Hubert Butcher. We have three children: Tracy Danielle, Daniel Trevor and Danni Morgan Blevins. Tracy has a degree in Sociology from Morehead State University, Trevor is currently attending Morehead State University where he is pursuing a double major in English and History, and Danni Morgan is a Junior attending Johnson Central High School.


RECOGNITIONS & CONGRATULATIONS
