She is survived by a brother, Tim (Glenna) Wells of Alabama; son-in-law, Dr. Chris Green, of



DISEASES THAT RUN IN THE WELLS FAMILY & CONNECTING FAMILIES

It was brought to my attention that there are so many different kinds of diseases that members of the Wells family have suffered from. It was suggested that we should include them in the newsletter. This is for your benefit, and if you should have any of these diseases and you would like to correspond with some of the members just let us know and we will make every effort to connect you. This may be of help to your doctor when diagnosing your condition. You will be surprised to see all the different diseases that one or more of our relatives have had or does have at this time. If any of you know of other Wells Family diseases that are not listed, we would love to hear from you. I did this listing some years ago, and it has been requested that we do an update since other diseases have hit our loved ones. I am updating this list and hope that it will be of some help to some of you.

Pituitary problems or Tumors, Heart Condition, strokes, Cancer of all kinds, Diabetes Types 1 and 2, Ulcers, Asthma, Detached Retina, Epilepsy, Rheumatoid Arthritis, Rupture (hernia), Cirrhosis of Liver, High Cholesterol, High Triglycerides, Hypertension, Osteoarthritis, Vertigo, Prostate Problems, Sinus Problems, Dermatitis, Tinnitus (ringing in ears). Paget Disease, Atherosclerosis (hardening of the arteries), Pulmonary Fibrosis, Chiari Malformation

Heart Conditions - Heart conditions include a wide variety of diseases, disorders and conditions that affect the heart and sometimes the blood vessels. Types of heart conditions include angina, heart attack (myocardial infarction) atherosclerosis, heart failure, cardiovascular disease, and cardiac arrhythmias (abnormal heart rhythms).

Strokes - Medical definition for strokes is sudden death of brain cells due to lack of oxygen, caused by blockage of blood flow or rupture of an artery to the brain, sudden loss of speech, weakness, or paralysis of one side of the body.

Migraines, Cluster headaches (CH) - a neurological disorder characterized by recurrent severe headaches on one side of the head, typically around the eye. There is often accompanying eye watering, nasal congestion, or swelling around the eye on the affected side. These symptoms typically last 15 minutes to 3 hours.

Hypertension - Hypertension, also known as high blood pressure, is a long-term medical condition in which the blood pressure in the arteries is persistently elevated. High blood pressure typically does not cause symptoms. Long-term high blood pressure, however, is a major risk factor for coronary artery disease, stroke, heart failure, atrial fibrillation, peripheral vascular disease, vision loss, chronic kidney disease, and dementia.

Alzheimer's - Alzheimer's disease (AD), also referred to simply as Alzheimer's, is a chronic neurodegenerative disease that usually starts slowly and worsens over time. It is the cause of 60–70% of cases of dementia. The most common early symptom is difficulty in remembering recent events (short-term memory loss). As the disease advances, symptoms can include problems with language, disorientation (including easily getting lost), mood swings, loss of motivation, not managing self-care, and behavioral issues. As a person's condition declines, they often withdraw from family and society. Gradually, bodily functions are lost, ultimately leading to death. Although the speed of progression can vary, the typical life expectancy following diagnosis is three to nine years.

CVID – Common Variable Immunodeficiency (CVID) is an immune disorder characterized by recurrent infections and low antibody levels. It is a disorder that impairs the immune system. People with CVID are highly susceptible to infection from foreign invaders such as bacteria or, more rarely, viruses and often develop recurrent infections, particularly in the lungs, sinuses and ears. There is currently no cure for CVID, but treatment can help alleviate symptoms and prevent infection that are associated with the diseases.

Behcet's Disease - also called Behcet's Syndrome – A very rare autoimmune disease that causes blood vessel inflammation throughout your body. This disease originated in the Middle East and is very rare in the USA.

According to the Mayo Clinic can cause serious complications, such as blindness. It can attack any part of the body, and it is possible for some to live a long life under the care of a doctor. There is no cure for Behcet's Disease, but it is possible to live a full life for many years. The terrible disease is in our family and was diagnosed by Cleveland Clinic.

Hemochromatosis - A genetic disease marked by excessive absorption and accumulation of Iron in the body.

Neuropathy - also called peripheral neuropathy - refers to any condition that affects the normal activity of the nerves of the peripheral nervous system. Causes can be both inherited and acquired. Diabetes is often followed with neuropathy.

Mitral Valve Prolapses - A common, occasionally serious condition, in which the flaps of the mitral valve prolapse into the left atrium during systole. In some patients, there are no symptoms but, in some, there may be non-manageable chest pain, palpitations, dyspnea, and fatigue.

Fibromyalgia - Chronic pain in the muscles and soft tissues surrounding joints.

Lupus - An inflammatory disease caused when the immune system attacks its own tissues. Treatment may help but there are no cures.

Psoriasis - A common chronic disease of the skin. It may be in any location but frequently is located on scalp knees, elbows, umbilicus, and genitalia.

Lichen Planus - an inflammatory condition that can affect the skin, hair, nails and mucous membranes. On the skin, lichen planus usually appears as purplish, often itchy, flat-topped bumps, developing over several weeks. When lichen planus causes pain, burning, redness, blisters, sores, or ulcers which can appear on the genitals, it can be treated. Some medicine is applied to the sores. Other medicine comes in pill form. Any mouth disease can lead to gum disease.

Hidradenitis Suppurativa - A chronic skin condition featuring lumps in places such as the armpits or groin. This condition can't be cured. Chronic, can last for years or be lifelong. The condition features pea-to-marble sized lumps under the skin that can be painful and tend to enlarge and drain pus, usually appears where skin rubs together, such as in the armpit, groin, and buttocks.

Alopecia - Sudden hair loss that starts with one or more circular bald patches that may overlap. Treatment helps but can't be cured. It is a common auto immune skin disease causing hair loss on the scalp, face and sometimes on other parts of the body.

Multiple Sclerosis - A chronic, often progressive neurological disease, also known as MS, in which the immune system attacks the protective sheath around nerve fibers, causing walking difficulties, muscle weakness and spasticity, and fatigue.

Parkinson's Diseases - Parkinson's disease is caused by a loss of nerve cells in substantia nigra of the brain. This leads to a reduction in a chemical called dopamine in the brain. Many different symptoms are associated with Parkinson's disease and the more common symptoms are slowness in movement and muscle stiffness. Currently there is no cure for Parkinson's disease. But treatments are available to help relieve the symptoms and maintain quality of life. These treatments include: supportive therapies – such as physiotherapy - medication - surgery.

Colon Issues - Risk factors for cancer of the colon and rectum (colorectal cancer) include colon polyps, long-standing ulcerative colitis, and genetic family history. Most colorectal cancers develop from polyps.

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Asthma- a respiratory condition marked by spasms in the bronchi of the lungs, causing difficulty in breathing. It usually results from an allergic reaction or other forms of hypersensitivity

GERD (Gastroesophageal reflux disease) Heartburn - also known as acid reflux, can sometimes cause a tightening sensation in the chest... However, it's unlikely that GERD is causing your heart palpitations."

Rheumatoid Arthritis, a chronic progressive disease, causing inflammation in the joints and resulting in painful deformity and immobility, especially in the fingers, wrists, feet, and ankles. Compare with osteoarthritis.

Osteoarthritis - degeneration of joint cartilage and the underlying bone, most common from middle age onward. It causes pain and stiffness, especially in the hip, knee, and thumb joints .Compare with rheumatoid arthritis.

Psoriatic Arthritis - Definition - Psoriatic arthritis is a form of arthritic joint disease associated with the chronic skin scaling and fingernail changes seen in psoriasis. Physicians recognize a number of different forms of Psoriatic Arthritis. In some patients, the arthritic symptoms will affect the small joints at the ends of the fingers and toes.

Scleroderma - Scleroderma (skleer-oh-DUR-muh) is a group of rare diseases that involve the hardening and tightening of the skin and connective tissues — the fibers that provide the framework and support for your body. In some people, scleroderma affects only the skin. But in many people, scleroderma also harms structures beyond the skin — such as blood.

Hepatitis A, B & C - There are three types of Hepatitis, but I am going to only give Hepatitis C, since this is the one that members of family have experienced. Hepatitis C: Inflammation of the liver due to the Hepatitis C virus (HCV), which is usually spread via blood transfusion (rare), hemodialysis, and needle sticks. The damage Hepatitis C does to the liver can lead to cirrhosis and its complications as well as cancer.

Diabetes – TYPE 1 DIABETES OR JUVENILE DIABETES – This type is a result of an auto immune disease attacking the pancreas resulting in the pancreas being unable to produce insulin and can occur anytime from a child's birth through the teen years. There is no cure for this type, and the person must take insulin injections daily for their lifetime. There is much research being done toward the development of an artificial pancreas and other treatments. TYPE 2 - Diabetes Mellitus: More commonly referred to as "diabetes" - a chronic disease associated with abnormally high levels of the sugar glucose in the blood. This type of diabetes develops usually in adulthood and can be controlled by diet and medication. Type 2 diabetes is usually the result of an inadequate production of insulin.

Celiac Disease - a disease in which the small intestine is hypersensitive to gluten, leading to difficulty in digesting food.

Crohn's Disease - The exact cause is unknown but heredity and malfunctioning immune system play a role. Common symptoms include abdominal pain, diarrhea, malnutrition and fatigue. Anti-inflammatory drugs and immune system suppressors help in long term remission.

PBC and Ulcerative Colitis - ulcerative colitis a recurrent acute and chronic disorder characterized by extensive inflammatory ulceration in the colon, chiefly of the mucosa and submucosa. The etiology is unknown; hence, the term idiopathic is used in reference to ulcerative colitis. Inflammation of the colon.

Acute Myalgia - Myalgia, or muscle pain, is a symptom of many diseases and disorders. The most common causes are the overuse or over-stretching of a muscle or group of muscles. Myalgia without a traumatic history is often due to viral infections. Longer-term myalgias may be indicative of a metabolic myopathy, some nutritional deficiencies or chronic fatigue syndrome.

Vasculitis - refers to a varied group of disorders which all share a common underlying problem of inflammation of a blood vessel or blood vessels. The inflammation may affect any size blood vessel, anywhere in the body.

Sulfite Allergies – Sulfite are preservatives used in some drinks, foods and occasionally medication. Sulfites can cause allergy-like reactions (intolerances), most commonly asthma symptoms in those with underlying asthma. You can be allergic to many medications that have sulfites in it as well as sulfa drugs.

Aspirin Allergies - (Salicylates) Salicylates A group of anti-inflammatory, mildly ANALGESIC and fever-reducing (antipyretic) drugs that includes aspirin, sodium Salicylates and BENORYLATE (benorilate). Salicylates - A group of drugs that includes aspirin and related compounds.

Schizophrenia - a long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behavior, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation.

Hypothyroidism - Hypothyroidism is a common condition resulting from decreased production of thyroid hormones from the thyroid gland. The symptoms vary from person to person. Commonly noted symptoms include tiredness, weight gain, puffy face, hoarseness, and increased blood cholesterol levels. Synthetic thyroid hormones are prescribed to treat the condition.

Graves' Disease - A swelling of the neck and protrusion of the eyes resulting from an overactive thyroid gland. Also called exophthalmic goiter.
